Any future violation will result in total alcohol activities suspension for a minimum of one full semester.</p> <p>4) It is strongly recommended that Beta Theta Pi create a rule stating that the Social Chair must be a designated sober officer at all GAMMA registered events.</p>	Completed

This contract should include the expectations set forth by Amy Mamula, Director of Kinder Care, and also include a provision that limits noise and music in the common area courtyard during weekdays before 7pm. Please include a standards policy that outlines the process should a member violate the Good Neighbor Agreement Plan. A copy of this agreement should be turned in to the Greek Standards Board mailbox in the FSP Office by January 18th, 2012.</p> <p>2) The Greek Standards Board strongly recommends posting the Good Neighbor Agreement somewhere visible in the house where all members can refer to it, as well as reviewing the agreement at the beginning of each semester.</p> <p>3) Invite Amy Mamula, Kinder Care Director, to speak at a new member meeting during the first month of pledgeship during the Spring 2013 semester so that new members will understand the importance of positive and respectful intergroup relations going forward.</p> <p>4) Delta Tau Delta will need to ensure that the individual member responsible for damaging the play structure meet with Amy Mamula by December 14th, 2012, to create a timeline of volunteer responsibilities in order to pay back the damage that he has caused.</p> <p>5) The Greek Standards Board strongly recommends that Delta Tau Delta find a safer alternative to bleach when cleaning the chapter facility to protect the health of both its members and neighbors.</p> <p>6) The Greek Standards Board also strongly recommends that Delta Tau Delta chapter members volunteer and dedicate a day of service to the Kinder Care facility during the Spring 2013 semester as a sign of good faith and a commitment to positive relations moving forward.</p>	Completed

At least 80% of both active and new members must be present. A signed attendance sheet should be turned in to the Greek Standards Board mail box when this sanction has been completed.</p> <p>3) Following the GAMMA presentation, 80% of the chapter must pass an online GAMMA quiz. This must be completed by May 3rd, 2013.</p> <p>4) The President and Risk Management Chair are required to meet with the IFC Vice President of Risk Management Aaron Whitelock to go over best practices and tips for risk management before Phi Gamma Delta will be permitted to host a GAMMA event. Following this meeting, the President, Risk Management Chair, and a chapter advisor must meet with Johanne Ives in the FSP Office to review changes made to the risk management policies by May 3rd, 2013.</p> <p>5) The chapter must create a calendar of responsible live-in officers with contact information for each weekend through the end of the Spring 2013 semester. A signed attendance sheet should be turned in to the Greek Standards Board mail box when this sanction has been completed.</p> <p>3) The fraternity's Health Advocate should obtain a presentation on alcohol awareness and educate the chapter on this topic by April 1st, 2013. At least 80% of both active and new members must be present. A signed attendance sheet should be turned in to the Greek Standards Board mail box when this sanction has been completed. (If this sanction is completed at the same time as the Officer Liaison visit, only one attendance sheet is required.)</p> <p>4) The chapter's Sargent-At-Arms is required to attend the upcoming IFC Roundtable on Risk Management and subsequently meet with Jeremy Zilmer in the FSP Office to discuss potential valuable additions to the Pi Kappa Alpha risk management policies. Specifically, the chapter Sargent-At-Arms must create a new risk management policy with a specific protocol for assisting an endangered person within the chapter facility, should an emergency arise. Policy Chapter Guidelines	<p>1) Sigma Chi must invite the Philanthropy Advisory Board to give a presentation to the chapter at least 3 weeks before Derby Days occurs during the Fall 2013 semester.</p> <p>2) Following the PAB presentation, at least 80% of the chapter must take and pass an online quiz regarding PAB procedures and policies.</p> <p>3) In the Fall 2013 semester, 100% of all new members and 80% of active members must be TIPS trained before Derby Days is allowed to occur. TIPS training should be mandatory for all coaches and the risk management team.</p> <p>4) Before the next Derby Days period occurs, a preliminary auction script and plan must be sent to and approved by PAB a minimum of two weeks in advance.</p> <p>5) Sigma Chi must develop a detailed plan for how they will incorporate their "item" auction into Derby Days in a way that does not violate PAB policy and is a positive representation of the Greek community. The Greek Standards Board strongly suggests that Sigma Chi consider including in the auction plan several methods to make bidding smoother and less contentious, such as the use of bidding paddles or a designated bidder for each sorority. Sigma Chi should also consider making coaches ineligible to participate in the auction, so that the ability to win auction items between sorority chapters is more fair. This plan is due two weeks in advance of Derby Days along with the script.</p> <p>6) The Greek Standards Board suggests that Sigma Chi consider involving the Diamond Children's Medical Center during the talent show and auction by either inviting a representative to speak, or at least including information about the hospital before or during the event.</p> <p>7) The Greek Standards Board strongly suggests that Sigma Chi consider hiring security in the future to help with crowd control and generally discourage rowdiness and intoxicated members from attending Derby Days events.</p>	Ongoing
