This information is provided from UAPD. On 11/06/2022, a UAPD Officer was dispatched to 1414 1st Ave. Delta Tau Delta, in reference to a report of a loud party. The reporting party was an anonymous reporter to TPD. Upon arrival to the scene, the UAPD Officer could hear the music from where they parked their car at Drachman/N First Ave. As the officer was making their way to the front door, a group was leaving along with someone stating "don't drink and drive." There was roughly 20 - 30 people inside and an assortment of bottles and cans on the counter. The can that could be identified was a Twisted Tea. Next to the front door was a can of Ultra-Light Lager resting on the mailbox on the left side of the door. PAB Article II, Subsection 3, Subsection A - No event shall be associated with the consumption or distribution (or co-sponsorship with a beverage supplier or company) of alcohol. If participants or members of the sponsoring chapter are intoxicated, the event shall be shut down and the sponsoring chapter shall be sent to Greek Standards Board. Same rules apply for illegal drug use or use of mind-altering substances. i. The present PAB member(s) may use their best judgement in the situation to ensure that the event is running with good representation of Greek Life and the organization. ii. Host chapters must discuss the inappropriate activity of pregame prior to large events with at least 75% of members in attendance. PAB Article II, Subsection 3, Subsection B - Events shall be run in the best of taste and as a positive representation of Greek Life on campus. Therefore, events shall have no references to alcohol or drug use, nudity, racism, sexism, or any other derogatory or inappropriate behavior. Failure to do so shall result in suspension of that event for 1 year. If an event is deemed risky, the chapter must talk with the PAB Advisor about the event and approve all details through PAB and FSP Staff.	I am the Assistant Director of Operation in the School of Government & Public Policy and one of the Building Managers for the Social Sciences Building, and have been for nearly a decade. The School of Government & Public Policy occupies the 3rd floor of the Social Sciences Building, and this building is one of the campus buildings that hosts evening professional graduate degree program courses every night of the week in support of our MPA and MPP programs. The School received an email from one of those graduate students today regarding an incident in the building last night that was alarming to them. This incident was also reported to the Philosophy dept administrators, which occupies the 2nd floor of this building. At this time, I have spoken to the faculty member who was instructing our graduate course at this time and she referred to the incident as "initially very alarming" due to the volume and unexpected nature of the yelling and running in the hallways, but that she was able to discern that it was a group of very rowdy students rather than a threatening situation. But they admitted the first reaction was 'alarm'.	Responsible	Sigma Chi is prohibited from reserving classroom spaces until May 1st, 2023. The Chief Justice will inform Room and Course Scheduling (RCS) of this sanction. Sigma Chi is required to attend a 30-minute mediation with individuals affected by the disturbance to resolve the tension associated with the event. The President and Vice President must be in attendance at this mediation. This must be completed by January 31, 2023. The Chief Justice will schedule and facilitate the mediation. The Sigma Chi President and Chief Justice will establish a date and time that works best for the fraternity. Write a 500-word apology letter to the individuals involved in the complaint. Three separate letters must be addressed to the Assistant Director of SGPP, the Philosophy Professor, and the students respectively. The three letters must be written by the president and signed by every active member of your chapter. After about 10(ish) minutes of this, I gave in and removed my shirt and gave it to them.
