The following statement was submitted to Sigma Tau Gamma leadership.</p> <p>"In the Sigma Tau Gamma parking lot on August 27th, 2023, during the second round of recruitment activities we observed the actions of two Active Sig Tau Members and two (PNMs) leaving a closed room on the premises of the Sigma Tau fraternity house.</p> <p>At precisely 3:55 PM on August 27th, 2023, during the second round of recruitment, we arrived at the Sigma Tau parking lot with the purpose of transporting a PNM requiring transportation services. Upon approaching the fraternity house's parking lot, we witnessed two PNMs exiting a room that was visibly closed. Of significance was the fact that one of the PNMs was holding a can of "twisted tea," which was subsequently discarded to the side of the parking lot.</p> <p>This particular PNM then proceeded to embark on a vehicle driven by a member of the Sigma Tau Gamma fraternity. It was evident that the PNM was being transported to another chapter for the next round. Although the identity of the specific PNM could not be ascertained, it was noticeable that the PNM had been wearing a name tag. Following the departure of the PNM and upon disembarking from our vehicle, we approached the discarded can of twisted tea in the parking lot, confirming its nature. Subsequently, we located a member of the Sigma Tau chapter who had emerged from the connected house and engaged in a dialogue regarding the incident. The member exhibited a degree of discomfort in light of the accusations and promptly apologized for the actions witnessed. Importantly, the member tacitly acknowledged the accuracy of the assumption made and proceeded to dispose of the can in the bottom of the trash. We were then directed to talk to the recruitment chair of the chapter where he again apologized and stated that he had no recollection of this and was going to reiterate to his members this is unacceptable and investigate what occurred."</p>	Responsible	Sanctions put in place by the IFC	Completed

She was inside a toilet stall throwing up. While they were speaking with her, I overheard NAME REDACTED say she had 3-4 shots and 2 White Claws. After medical staff cleared her, I asked her if I had heard her correctly about her drinking alcohol. She confirmed again that she had three shots and two white claws. She reported a recent incident of loud music lasting over an hour, causing disruption to university staff in the Transitional Office Building. She requested Guzman's assistance in finding a lasting solution to prevent such disturbances during business hours and proposed scheduling a meeting to discuss the next steps. The files are far too large to send over email. The eggs were thrown at the back of our house, the basketball court, and the front. The front also had food thrown.</p> <p>I do want to make you aware, when these individuals threw eggs at the rear of the house, they threw them through an open window and the eggs hit the walls, beds, and even hit one of our members in the chest. Everyone is okay though. The individuals all would run a similar direction through the back alley between AXO and 7/11. This leads me to believe it is one specific house as that is not a through street.</p> <p>The last time we dealt with this was on March 20th, when many of our members had received word that we would be egged. The other house had purchased a lot of eggs and sent pictures out and those pictures were leaked and many of our members saw them. We also received threats to "be ready for later." That day, I called UAPD and asked for additional patrol as there were multiple vehicles scouting out our house and parking just in front to watch our guys. Most of these cars all would circle back to the ZBT parking lot when they were done. Their members kept grouping up out front that night as well and the police came to speak with us and we explained what was going on and they went to speak with the ZBT member and then nothing happened after that. That is the last time we dealt with this until last night.</p> <p><i>A follow up email was sent the following day -</i>  Just to let you know, again, we had more eggs thrown last night. I was not there and will not be home until later this afternoon to check footage. Theta Xi brought about 30 fans to support their team playing the championship game. Those fans brought alcohol to the field (see picture below) and were vaping on the field. Our supervisor noticed the vape and asked them to stop vaping 5 different times. The beer cans/drinking were discovered after the event was over or would have been addressed immediately.</p> <p>On top of this, the fans also brought out a megaphone and were yelling the word "fag" among other nasty things at the opposing team. They also were chewing sunflower seeds and spitting them at the opposing team's players when they were near their sideline. All of this led to our staff having to remove them from the facility, which Theta Xi's fans would not cooperate with. Our student staff had to pause the game and get the Theta Xi team to assist with getting their fans off the field. During the unwillingness to leave the field, one of our staff members called UA PD and asked for assistance. The fans of Theta Xi eventually left the field and went behind the gate of the field, which is still close to the field (see picture below). They continued to yell slurs and harass the opposing team from behind the fence. Upon conclusion of the game, UA PD arrived to the field. At the same time, Theta Xi's fans started to scale the fence and act like they were coming back onto the field to be aggressive with the opposing team, since Theta Xi had just lost. The cops flashed their lights when they saw this, and all of the people from Theta Xi promptly left the field. Our staff then talked to the police who said they would file a report to the Dean of Students about the event.</p> <p>I would like to note that the players that were playing for Theta Xi were extremely helpful towards our staff in trying to fix the situation but there were just too many rowdy fans.
