

Alpha Kappa Lambda 5-Year History

This report shows a comprehensive judicial history for Alpha Kappa Lambda the 5 years leading up to their loss of university recognition and includes any reports the university has received about the organization since. Below you will find some descriptions and definitions of the different sections of the report.

- **Investigating Entity:** The entity that oversaw the investigation. These entities can work in partnership or independently, depending on the details of the allegation.
 - Dean of Students (DOS)– University of Arizona Student Assistance and Accountability
 - Greek Standards Board (GSB)– Community Peer Judicial Board
 - Headquarters (HQ) – organization headquarters/ [inter]national offices
- **Alleged Policy Violation:** these policies can be found on the overseeing department’s website. Please note some policies may have changed since the allegation. All university policies are available for public viewing, headquarters policies may be known to members/HQ staff only.
- **Outcome:** At the conclusion of an investigation, an outcome will be given. Throughout the investigation, it can be determined that an organization is not responsible but individual members are.
 - Responsible: More like than not the chapter/ chapter members committed the allegation.
 - Not Responsible: Evidence shows organization did not commit the allegation -OR- insufficient evidence to determine responsibility.
- **Nature of Complaint:** a copy or summary of the report that resulted in an investigation.
- **Sanctions:** actions that must be completed for the chapter’s good-standing to be re-instated

Once an organization has lost university recognition, the university has no jurisdiction to investigate reports. If the university receives reports of known or suspected policy violations, it is sent to local law enforcement (if applicable) and the national organization.

Despite attempts to address the noise during quiet hours, the situation escalated, leading the family to call the campsite manager and eventually the sheriff's department. Concerned for their safety, the family decided to leave, missing out on time with others and experiencing frustration with the fraternity's lack of respect. They commend one member for his attempt to address the situation but highlight the challenges of controlling a large group under the influence of alcohol.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Alpha Kappa Lambda's new executive team must meet with your assigned Fraternity and Sorority Programs advisor to review and discuss your executive members' transition manuals and university policies regarding event planning and registration. 2. Alpha Kappa Lambda must give an events with alcohol presentation to ensure all members understand alcohol safety and registration. This presentation must be given to 75% of the chapter. 3. Every member of Alpha Kappa Lambda must complete 2 community service hours each.
