Dear President :

Pursuant to the Arizona Board of Regents Policy 5-401, et.seq. and in accordance with the Arizona Board of Regents Student Code of Conduct, this letter is to inform you that **effective immediately**, **is placed on** *Activities Suspension*. *Activities Suspension* has been imposed pending the outcome of this investigation because it has been determined that your organization presents a substantial risk to members of the university community. *Activities Suspension* prohibits hosting, attending, participating, and sponsoring any organizational activities until the final disposition of this case. Club business meetings are the only allowed activities during this suspension. is prohibited from any contact with new members unless approved by the Dean of Students Office.

Between October 17, 2024, and October 23, 2024, the Dean of Students Office received several reports of Phi Delta Theta allegedly subjecting new members to hazing throughout the Fall 2024 New Member process. Per the reports, new members are required to engage in 3 hour workouts; "watch the flag" at the house until 2 or 3 AM about 3 to 5 days a week; perform embarrassing acts for social media; consume alcohol; and pick up food for active members at 1 AM.

Such behavior is in violation of the Arizona Board of Regents Student Code of Conduct, pertinent parts of which are stated below:

Code of Conduct/15. Alcohol - Violation of Board or university rules or applicable laws governing alcohol, including consumption, distribution, unauthorized sale, or possession of alcoholic beverages.

Code of Conduct/19. Hazing - Engaging in, supporting, promoting, or sponsoring hazing or violating Board or University rules governing hazing.

Code of Conduct/2. Endangering / Threat / Cause Harm - Endangering, threatening, or causing physical harm to any member of the university community or to oneself, causing reasonable apprehension of such harm or engaging in conduct or communications that a reasonable person would interpret as a serious expression of intent to harm.

In order to discuss the allegation pending against the fraternity, a **meeting should take place by November 4, 2024**. When we meet, I shall answer questions and explain the Student Code of Conduct Disciplinary process. It is expected that fully cooperate with this investigation. Any acts impeding the disciplinary process are prohibited.
