The Greek Standards Board has received a complaint against Delta Gamma for allegedly violating the Student Code of Conduct.

Policy Allegedly Violated

Code of Conduct 11. Interfering with or disrupting university or university-sponsored activities, including but not limited to classroom-related activities, studying, teaching, research, intellectual or creative endeavor, administration, service or the provision of communication, computing or emergency services.

Nature of Complaint:

Room and Course Scheduling notified [REDACTED] of concerns raised by Facilities Management when they were present at the Delta Gamma Philanthropy event held in Social Sciences 100. This report highlights concerns regarding the recent use of Social Sciences 100 for a Delta Gamma philanthropy event, where custodial staff reported significant disruptions, including inappropriate behavior by attendees, a substantial mess involving streamers and party supplies, and a lack of adequate cleanup after the event. Male students were reportedly seen in little to no clothing, and the excessive celebration required extensive cleaning efforts, initially supported by a church group using the space on Sunday, with additional custodial work needed to prepare for the academic week. A custodial team member recorded video footage that was shared and viewed by [REDACTED] that further documented the event conditions.

Next Steps:

1. The Greek Standards Board requests a written explanation from Delta Gamma regarding the incident in question. The explanation is due to the Greek Standards Board email (gsb.chiefjustice@gmail.com) by **Wednesday, November 13th, 2024, at noon.**
2. The hearing for your case is currently scheduled for **5:30 pm on Wednesday, November 13th, 2024.** The Board encourages you to bring persons whom you think would present relevant information regarding this matter. The hearing will take place in room 412 in the student union, across from the CSIL.
3. As part of the forthcoming hearing, your chapter has the right to a fair process. Fair process rights are as follows:
 1. Right to be notified, in writing, of all charges.
 2. Right to present a response, including the calling of witnesses

3. Right to question witnesses
 4. Right to be accompanied by an advisor for advisory purposes only, but not for representation
 5. Right to be notified, in writing, of all findings and sanctions imposed
 6. Right to appeal the decisions
4. The Greek Standards Board will then conclude with a decision based on the information presented at the hearing. The Board will inform your chapter on its decision within two days of the hearing.
 5. If the chapter wishes to appeal the decision of the Board, you are required to do so in writing within ten days of the date on the decision letter.

It is the intention of the Greek Standards Board to investigate all sides of the issue thoroughly, and to reach the most appropriate conclusion. If you have any questions about the process, please do not hesitate to contact me at gsb.chiefjustice@gmail.com.
