The Greek Standards Board has received a complaint against Theta Xi for allegedly violating **the Social Events Policy**.

**Policy Allegedly Violated:**

*Social Events Policy, Article I, Section A:*

- *All events as part of this policy must be registered with the Fraternity and Sorority Programs Office.*

**Nature of Complaint:**

“On the night of 4/9/26, UAPD officers on party patrol reported hearing loud music coming from the Theta Xi residence. UAPD also observed a DJ playing said loud music, as well as several female guests entering and exiting the Theta Xi property. Theta Xi did not have an event registered for the night of April 9. UAPD spoke with the chapter president and advised turning the music off.”

**The Complaint Via UAPD:**

“On 04/09/2026 at approximately 2339 hours, while working an event for registered parties for the Fraternity and Sorority Programs (FSP), [REDACTED] and I were patrolling the area of 1st Street and Cherry Blvd when we heard loud music coming from the Theta Xi Fraternity residence (1621 E. 1st St.). Theta Xi did not have a registered event scheduled for that date.

[REDACTED] and I approached the residence and observed several females entering and exiting. The door to the courtyard was open, and I observed a male DJ playing loud music. Upon noticing our presence, the male immediately ran off. A short time later, a male who identified himself as the house president, [REDACTED] came to the door. [REDACTED] stated that he did not believe they were having a party and claimed they only had a few friends over. [REDACTED] was advised to turn off the music and informed that FSP would be notified.

**Next Steps:**

1. The Greek Standards Board requests a written explanation from Theta Xi regarding the incident in question. The explanation is due to the Greek Standards Board email (gsb.chiefjustice@gmail.com) by Wednesday, April 29th, 2026 **at noon**.
2. The hearing for your case is currently scheduled for [REDACTED]. The Board encourages you to bring persons whom you think would present relevant information regarding this matter. The hearing will take place in [REDACTED].

3. As part of the forthcoming hearing, your chapter has the right to a fair process. Fair process rights are as follows:
  1. Right to be notified, in writing, of all charges.
  2. Right to present a response, including the calling of witnesses
  3. Right to question witnesses
  4. Right to be accompanied by an advisor for advisory purposes only, but not for representation
  5. Right to be notified, in writing, of all findings and sanctions imposed
  6. Right to appeal the decisions
4. The Greek Standards Board will then conclude with a decision based on the information presented at the hearing. The Board will inform your chapter on its decision within two days of the hearing.
5. If the chapter wishes to appeal the decision of the Board, you are required to do so in writing within ten days of the date on the decision letter.
