It was a video of our current house with their letters on it saying they are living here soon. While this may seem insignificant, what came was most definitely not. For starters, I was under the impression we could not make new promotional posts during rush, especially posting in the middle of a rush event. Also, it clearly states to have no posts targeting or attacking another house. We have now had a multitude of kids come to our house during the WRONG round because they are under the impression that Delta Chi currently lives here. To add onto things, in the comments of said instagram post, 7 Delta Chi Fraternity Members began to make very antisemitic remarks within the comments. This was taken and posted all over on other social media platforms like TikTok leading to a mass output of antisemitic remarks regarding ZBT on tiktok and instagram." "5-6 Delta Chi Members [REDACTED] (Not a member but biological brother of member [REDACTED]). All posted antisemitic remarks on the registered instagram below, detailing 'golbim' running around scattering for coins, Rabi's waving goodbye, Rabi's making remarks in Hebrew which is obviously a directed attack at our house, as a rationally jewish fraternity. Not only did this post significantly impact and hurt our rush, it has caused an immense amount of antisemitic hatred online that has impacted our members significantly. While an independent observer may not see these comments and 'GIF' images/videos as a threat or hate speech, those of us who have lived through antisemitism and other hate speech online can read the message loud and clear. Jewish members of our house confirm these are the same deliberate images (depicting goblins grabbing for money, jewish-looking characters being killed in video-game violence, and other similar stereotypical depictions) that have been used time and time again across pretty much every antisemitic social media post & comment section one haplessly scrolls onto. Hear this now; this is not vague imagery, or comments that can only be tied to antisemitism through association; but this is in-fact the direct tools and propaganda that has been used online to make jewish students feel scared, helpless, and unsafe. In a post that is clearly meant to target and defame our house it is more than a clear message of hatred and potential violence, one that is entirely unwarranted, has many of my close friends as scared to be a jew as they have ever been." My house has double insulated windows and decently thick walls. It is usually quiet inside but I can feel the bass rattling the whole house."
