This letter confirms the Greek Standards Board meeting on September 11, 2019 regarding Phi Delta Theta's alleged violation of the Fraternity and Sorority Programs Events with Alcohol Policy. Based on the testimony presented during the hearing of your case, the Greek Standards Board, after a 8-0 vote, has determined that your chapter is responsible for the violation of the Fraternity and Sorority Programs Events with Alcohol Policy.

Policy Violated:

Events with Alcohol Policy; Section 2. Registration - All events involving alcohol must be registered with the Fraternity and Sorority Programs Office.

Events with Alcohol Policy Section 3 – Alcohol - No members, collectively or individually, shall purchase for, serve to, or sell alcoholic beverages to any individual under the age of 21

This decision was based on careful consideration of all the information before the Greek Standards Board, which included President [REDACTED] being cited as appearing intoxicated and admitting to consuming alcohol on the night of the incident both to UAPD on the night in question, as well as to the Greek Standards Board at the time of the meeting. His state of intoxicated potentially impaired his memory and/or perceptions of the event making it more likely than not that his witness statement is not entirely credible. It was admitted that a member or members of the fraternity may have snuck alcohol into the chapter facility during the event and served it to guests without identifying the age of individuals. UAPD's report also states that a witness was provided alcohol by fraternity without being ID and was under the age of 21. The admission of the potential for this to occur combined with the police report led the board to believe it is more likely than not that there was alcohol present and served in the Phi Delta Theta chapter facility on March 29, 2019. This decision was based on the preponderance of the evidence, meaning whether it was more likely than not that the alleged conduct or behavior occurred.

As a result of this decision, the board has agreed that the following sanction shall be imposed on your chapter.

Phi Delta Theta must

1. Pay \$25 per active member (80) of the chapter due to violation of the Student Code of Conduct. The total amount is \$2,000.00. If an invoice is needed, please contact rsalazar@email.arizona.edu. Please remit payment to the Dean of Student Office by **Friday, September 27th by 5 p.m.**
2. Create a presentation explaining risk management procedures and regulations followed by the fraternity at all registered event without alcohol. This presentation will be given to the entire chapter including new members. This presentation must be sent to Greek Standards Board along with proof of chapter attendance via picture or an attendance list with signatures of members. You may email proof to gsb.chiefjustice@gmail.com. This presentation is due by **Friday, September 27th by 5 p.m.**

The Greek Standards Board suggests:

1. It may prove beneficial to require one or more of the following executive members to serve as “sober monitors” at every event: President, Vice President, and/or Risk Manager.

Phi Delta Theta has the right to an appeal. A written request must be submitted to DOS-deanofstudents@email.arizona.edu September 20, 2019 at 5:00pm. Your written request must include rationale for the appeal. All appeals will be reviewed by the Dean of Students Office.
