Dear Erin McHale:

On July 2, 2020, the central office of Beta Theta Pi notified the Dean of Students Office of the decision to suspend the charter of the Delta Beta chapter of Beta Theta Pi.

In accordance with the University of Arizona Club & Organization Handbook (http://media.wix.com/ugd/526828_4e97b0ed41fb4c228dfbec2fbba7e663.pdf), Social Greek Letter Organizations, Section II, Page 6. Requirements for Maintaining Recognition states: Each chapter must remain in good standing with its national/international fraternity or sorority.

Effective immediately, The University of Arizona has withdrawn recognition of the Delta Beta Chapter of Beta Theta Pi in response to the central office charter suspension.

Loss of recognition means the withdrawal of the fraternity as a recognized student organization on the university campus. An unrecognized student organization cannot participate in any University sponsored event and loses the use of University facilities and resources.

If the central office of Beta Theta Pi expresses interest in returning to the University of Arizona prior to 2020, completion of any outstanding sanctions would be required prior for Beta Theta Pi being considered for UA Recognition.

Since recognition at the UA is contingent on being in good standing with Beta Theta Pi, the UA Club Recognition process does not provide for a formal appeal of Loss of Recognition in this instance.
