Philanthropy

1. Sigma Phi Epsilon must outline a prospective contract of Sig Ep Regatta that will be shared with the Campus Recreation in further years if this philanthropy event continue to ensure both Sigma Phi Epsilon and the Campus Rec have expectations and guidelines to follow for the event. The contract will be due October 19th by 5pm. 2. Sigma Phi Epsilon must outline the expectations and rules for members and coaches of Sig Ep Regatta. This must include what expectations coaches have before and on the day of the event and will be due October 19th by 5pm. 3. In order to rectify the relationship between Sigma Phi Epsilon and Alpha Sigma Alpha, Sigma Phi Epsilon must organize and hold a social dry event with Alpha Sigma Alpha. The executive board of Sigma Phi Epsilon along with 50% of the chapter must be present. Sigma Phi Epsilon must post a picture of the event on their Instagram. Proof of this event must be sent by November 2nd by 5pm. 4. Sigma Phi Epsilon must hold a communication and planning retreat for the executive board and any members involved with planning philanthropy events. Proof of the retreat including a picture of the event as well as an attendance sheet of the members who attended will be due by October 26th by 5pm. 5.
