

Fall 2019 Greek Speak: Love, Mom and Dad

Overview & Summary

On September 24th, 2019, Fraternity & Sorority Programs at The University of Arizona hosted Lianne Kowiak and Rich Braham as part of National Hazing Prevention Week. The topic of the Fall 2019 Greek Speak was hazing. In their talk titled "Love, Mom and Dad," Lianne and Rich represented PUSH (#ParentsUnited2StopHazing) and discussed the impact of hazing and how they lost their loved ones to hazing-related incidents.

Major Takeaways

- » Reporting Hazing-Related Incidents
 - The respondents for the Fall 2019 Greek Speak follow-up survey are more likely than not to report hazing both within their own chapters (75.35% of responses were likely/very likely) and if seen on campus (87.02% of responses were likely/very likely).
 - > After the presentation, there was a **41.79% increase** in responses for being very familiar or extremely familiar with how and where to report hazing seen on campus.
 - > When asked if they benefited from hearing Lianne and Rich's story, **98.15% of respondents** agreed or strongly agreed that the it was beneficial.

Implications

- » Technology
 - > The QR code was used with the assumption that all attendees had access to a smart phone or other device with the ability to scan the code and be linked to the follow-up survey.
- » Attendance
 - Not everyone in attendance completed the survey due to technical difficulties. While there were 1,781 respondents for the survey, the venue of Centennial Hall seats 2,500 and was almost at full capacity for this event.
 - Tickets were given at the door to track attendance and suggests 2,276 seats were filled.
- » Survey Questions
 - > The response choices for "Before/After today's presentation, how confident were/are you in your ability to recognize hazing in Greek Life?" should have been written in terms of levels of confidence rather than involving a scale of strongly disagree to strongly agree.
 - Respondents were able to select more than one answer for scaled questions (very unlikely to very likely, not at all familiar to extremely familiar, strongly disagree to strongly agree). The data in the first and second points under "Major Takeaways" calculates the number of responses rather than the number or respondents.

Methods

At the conclusion of the event, attendees were asked to scan a QR code (see below) projected on a large screen which brought them to a follow-up survey. The following questions gathered quantitative data.

Survey

- » Demographics
 - > Which organization do you belong to?
 - > What is your chapter member status?



- » Hazing-Related Questions
 - > How likely are you to report hazing within your own chapter?
 - > How likely are you to report hazing if seen on campus?
 - Before today's presentation, how knowledgeable were you in how and where to report hazing seen on campus?
 - After today's presentation, how knowledgeable are you in how and where to report hazing seen on campus?
 - > Before today's presentation, how confident were you in your ability to recognize hazing in Greek Life?
 - After today's presentation, how confident are you in your ability to recognize hazing in Greek Life?
 - > I benefitted from hearing Lianne and Rich's story.




» What is your chapter member status?


